friendship, family, intimacy, sense of connection

SAFETY AND SECURITY

health, employment, property, family and social abilty

PHYSIOLOGICAL NEEDS

breathing, food, water, shelter, clothing, sleep

Graduate School: Interventions

Campus resources –advertised to undergraduate students

Grad School:

- → Advocacy for extended services
- →education of campus units of grad students needs and expansion of their promotion of services to all students

How: Dr. Miller's role: changed



Support services

Strengthening the partnership with Division of Student Life to support:

- Mental health
- Extend university support services to graduate students
- Develop a mechanism to prevent challenging situations before they implode

Parent Student Success scholarship

22-23% of grad students have children (per surveys)

- Created a scholarship
- 5 semesters of funding
- Fundraising initiative launched in Fall 2021
- Educating campus community about the need

Parent Student Success scholarship

Impact: 53% applicants funded; 39% of reported monthly financial need addressed

Applications: 197 received across 5 semesters, average 40/semester

Funding provided: \$500-\$1,000 per student

Needs addressed: daycare/babysitting, health/medical, food, clothing



Getting to Success!

- 1. Recognition of potential and excellence through Funding
- Donoghue scholarship for incoming grad students – expanded
- Restructuring of funds into accelerated and excellence scholarships
- 2. Data driven initiatives



Initiatives Launched

Launched Summer 2021 - on-going

Engagement (webinars) and communication with admitted students by type of students – addressing summer melt

Launched Fall 2021 on-going

Incomplete grade report sent to departments with a reminder of how to support graduate students

Probationary reports send to department and to students with the request to development grad student success plans to take the student back in good academic standing.

Degree completion AWOL - initiative to return back to KSU students who went missing for 5 years or more.

Reduced course load processing (international students) and communication update to support retention of international students

Launched Spring 2022 - ongoing

Student's readiness for defense survey (policy change). To assess the student's readiness and the supervisory committees' opinion of the student's readiness for defense

AY 22-23 work

Streamline hiring process for international students (addressing lack of SSN)



Empower faculty to strengthen relationships with grad students

Created a Dashboard:

Academic units:

- Understand the academic "journey" of the grad students/academic program
- Benchmarking analysis
- Planning and program revisions/development

The Graduate School:

- Analyze trends and do benchmark analysis
- Identify and disseminate best practices
- Policies/process that need revised



Empower Graduate Student Council:

- Offer professional development and research presentation opportunities
- Build community among graduate students
- Ensure graduate student representation on university committees
