What is the Graduate Student Experience at your institution?

This is fundamentally a research question:

- What is known about it?
- Who has the data? Any data?
- Who are the stakeholders?
- What are the cultural differences and drivers?
- How is graduate education organized/administered?
- What research has been done on the GSE at your institution?
- What is the overall impact of graduate education and graduate students at your institution?
- How do the roles and functioning of undergraduate education and support services impact graduate education?



Key Questions About the Graduate Student Experience:

- What is the graduate student experience?
- What are the needs of graduate students?
- Which of these needs are we intentionally addressing?
- Who is responsible for such responses?
- What are the unmet needs of graduate students?
- What is the evidence to support this conversation?



Key Questions About the Graduate Student Experience:

- What are the services and resources available to support graduate students?
- Is there evidence of hardship/neglect of students' welfare (e.g. housing food insecurity, mental health support, mentoring, support groups, etc.)?
- What campus services/resources for undergraduate students are ALSO available for graduate students?
- Are there services available to undergraduate students that are NOT available to graduate students?
- Have there been efforts to organize a consideration like this before? If so, what were the results?
- What efforts are being made to enhance the GSE at our peer institutions?



Key Questions About the Graduate Student Experience:



What facets of the Graduate Student Experience must be addressed at the institutional level?

At the unit level?



Essential Functions for Institution-wide Consideration

- Orientation to the institution and the graduate program
- Academic advising
- Mentoring
- Graduate teaching assistant support/training
- Socialization needs for graduate students
- Understanding the graduate school and unit culture
- Mental health support
- Health support writ large
- Housing assistance
- Childcare



To Advance a Campus Conversation..

...you need:

- A working conceptual statement of what you are talking about
 This could be a generic definition of The Graduate Student
 Experience
- A clear statement of why this conversation is needed
 Don't assume the "whys" will be immediately understood
- A companion statement of why graduate students and graduate education matters..
 ..not just to the graduate units but to the entire institution
- Why the GSE matters to the community, region, state and country
